

Chotiner Pediatric Cancer Research Funding Opportunity 2017

The Chotiner Pediatric fund supports Pediatric Cancer Research at Moffitt Cancer Center.

Purpose: Moffitt Leadership invites investigators to apply for pilot funding in the area of pediatric cancer. Proposals must be focused on Pediatric Cancer with preference given to proposals in Sarcoma or a focus on Adolescents & Young Adults (AYA).

Eligibility: This opportunity is open to all Moffitt Faculty ranks (Assistant Member, Associate Member and Senior Member). Preference will be given to junior faculty applicants.

Application Materials: Submit as a single PDF file.

Proposal Requirements:

1. Face Page.
2. Abstract that describes project in lay language and how it impacts pediatric cancer treatment or prevention (250 words or less).
3. Specific Aims and Research Plan (2 page limit): NIH Format Arial 11 black font, single spaced with all text showing and 0.5 inch margins (all sides).
4. NIH Biosketch for key investigators (PIs or Co--PIs) to include on-going and pending internal and external support.
5. Budget (spreadsheet) and Budget Justification, Please complete the PHS 398 detailed budget form page 4, <http://grants2.nih.gov/grants/funding/phs398/phs398.html>.

Due Date: Application must be received by **4:00 pm on Tuesday, August 1, 2017**. Applications can be submitted as an e-mail attachment to Maureen Ahearn at maureen.ahearn@moffitt.org

Award Amount: Projects will be funded up to \$60,000 for one year, and if funds remain available, the possibility of an option to compete for a second year of funding based on a satisfactory progress report and justification of continued support.

Budget and allowable expenses: Faculty salaries are required but capped at 1% (cost-sharing not allowed). Funds for students, postdocs, and techs are allowable. Supplies, core services, publication costs, and meeting travel are all allowed.

Award Date: Anticipated start date is October 1, 2017.

Progress Report: At the end of the first year of funding, the PIs are required to submit a summary of work accomplished, including all manuscripts submitted or accepted, as well as any grant submissions (actual or planned) resulting from this support.
