**Please note, the Monthly Award Reports are sent out the first week of the month, so for the awards noted in this newsletter, the information has been taken from the most recent reports from the Office of Sponsored Research dated March of 2017. *Only new research awards are listed in the table below.* Of special note, Dr. Ann Chen was recently awarded a Moffitt Skin Cancer SPORE's Developmental Research Program's (DRP) grant entitled, "Integrated strategies combining HDAC and kinase inhibitors for melanoma patients".

For the new awards by research program processed in the month of March 2017, the Cancer Epidemiology Program submitted \$476,709 in proposals and received in \$2,626,962 in awards. The Health Outcomes and Behavior Program submitted \$81,676 in proposals and received \$36,364 in awards. (These numbers include non-competitive renewals and supplements.) Congratulations!
